He worshiped at St. Gerard Catholic Church where he served as an Usher at the 08:00 am masses on Sundays. He was a member of the Knight of Columbus.

He was a professional boxer under the name of Earl Citizen, "aka" Texas Cobra from February 1957 to April 1963, with twelve wins and seven knock -outs. He became a professional truck driver in 1963 In Beaumont, Texas where he was later transferred to San Antonio, Texas, due to, lack of black truck drivers in San Antonio, Texas. He retired as a professional truck driver in 1998.

Early was born to the union of the late Earl Citizen and late Minerva Duhon, June 24, 1937 in Welsh,

Louisiana. They moved to Beaumont, Texas where he was raised.

Early was preceded in death by his mother Minerva Duhon, father Earl Citizen and brother Frank Citizen.






To Our Sweet Dad Form Your Three Angels.


