Velma Jean, as she is affectionately called, was the youngest daughter of the late Henry Jackson and Ethel Berry, born on January 11, 1947. She was reared in Port Arthur, Tx and was a proud graduate of Lincoln High School. As a sign of her commitment to education and divine obligation to the Holy Word, she received an Associate and Bachelor’s degree in Biblical Studies from Royal Priesthood Christian Counseling and Academy in 2019 at the age of 70!
