MEMORIES OF "MOM-MOM"

Mrs. Bertha Mae (Knowles) Drake was born to Mr. & Mrs. Redmon (Grace Roberts) Knowles on May 3, 1917, in Hondo, Texas. She was their third child (following sister Eunice and brother Ralph).

She spent her childhood in Hondo and attended the Colored School which offered grades one through eleven under the tutelage of Professor & Mrs. Leroy Edmerson. She completed high school in San Antonio at Phillis Wheatley (Class of 1936).

One of the joys of Mrs. Drake's life was shopping for fabrics and sewing them into the fashions of the day. She excelled at it. She had learned to sew in high school classes and continued sewing throughout her lifetime—making garments for her daughter, for herself and—when she had time—for others who asked. All for whom she made garments were exceedingly pleased with her work, but—being very modest—she never believed she deserved the praise she received for the quality of her workmanship.

Mrs. Drake was a "giving" person. As she became aware of the plight of the sick and elderly people in her neighborhood, she seemed drawn to help them. Frequently she visited, prepared food and carried it to those in need and/or homebound. She continued to share even as she became "one of the elderly."

She was an avid San Antonio Spurs basketball fan. She happily watched their every area-televised game until

the last few weeks before her death. She played basketball as a young person and the interest obviously carried over to her adult life.

Mrs. Drake was a member of East St. Paul United Methodist Church for over sixty years—the oldest member. Dearly loved, she will sorely be missed for her quiet countenance, her resolve to help those in need, her gentle sense of humor and her unshakable stance on truth and "right." Her guiding principle---attributed to a high school teacher who countlessly quoted it to his classes---was: "Be always sure you're right, then go ahead."
