Life's Story

Rhoda Mae Crayton was born one of nine children on August 9, 1933 to Ed & Eliza Crayton. She accepted Christ at an early age and was baptized at Clearview Baptist Church. Later in life she attended Prince of Peace Baptist Church, Goodwill Baptist Church, and finally Calvary Baptist Church under Rev. Robert Miller.

She attended the Kingsbury School System and later worked in food service in the mess hall at Brooks Air Force Base for many years. She later trained as a dental assistant and began working for Dr. Harold E. Haywood where she remained until her mother, Eliza Crayton, became ill. She left the work force and took care of her mother, nursing her back to health without any experience. The doctors said there was nothing else they could do, but with God on her side, she cared for her mother, and she lived nine years before she died. In between caring for her mother, she did maid work and even opened her own thrift store called "Rhoda's Den".

Rhoda married Ray Cubit of Luling, TX at a very young age. They were separated but never divorced. She later met Roy Lee Freeman, Jr. of Gillett, TX and to that relationship, a baby girl was born (Letisha Ann) named after Roy's mother. Roy was killed in 1969. Much later in life, she met Ray Lee and he remained her faithful companion until his death in 2001.

Rhoda Mae Crayton Cubit loved antiques! She and her beloved companion, Ray Lee, took the antique world by storm. They sold antiques, furniture, clothing, dishes, and other household goods.

Rhoda had a generous soul. She loved everyone she met often taking in the homeless just to give them food, shelter, a bath, and a worm night's sleep. If you stopped by to see her, you would be leaving with something...a chair, table, lamp, a dish, or even money that she didn't have to offer. She just always wanted to do something for someone and if you wouldn't take anything, then you would have to wait for her to cook you something to eat. She loved serving others. Rhoda's passion, however, was gardening. She was the GOAT of gardening. With her love and care, she could bring a dead plant back to life. Her roses were her pride and joy and her surrounding neighbors would come to see her gardens every season. She would break off a piece of a plant and tell them how to make it grow. They would always come back unsuccessful, and she would do it all over again never tiring. She was affectionately known as Ms. Rose!

Rhoda was also strong willed. She survived breast cancer (1972), snake bite (2017), high blood pressure, congestive heart failure, gastric problems, hernia repair, kidney failure that led to dialysis, numerous surgeries, and other elements that kept her in and out of the hospital, always bouncing back. Until recently, when the doctor says dialysis is doing her more harm than good and decided to discontinue the treatment, by this time, she was tired and had already had her conversation with God.

She is preceded in death by her parents, Ed and Eliza Crayton; sisters, Oda Lee Jackson (James), Carrie Lee Hodge (Ernest), Eliza Mae Clack (Sonny); brothers Willie Ed Crayton (Celester), Lee Curtis Crayton (Dorothy), Ed Crayton, Jr. (Shirley), and Barnie Edward Crayton (Joyce).
