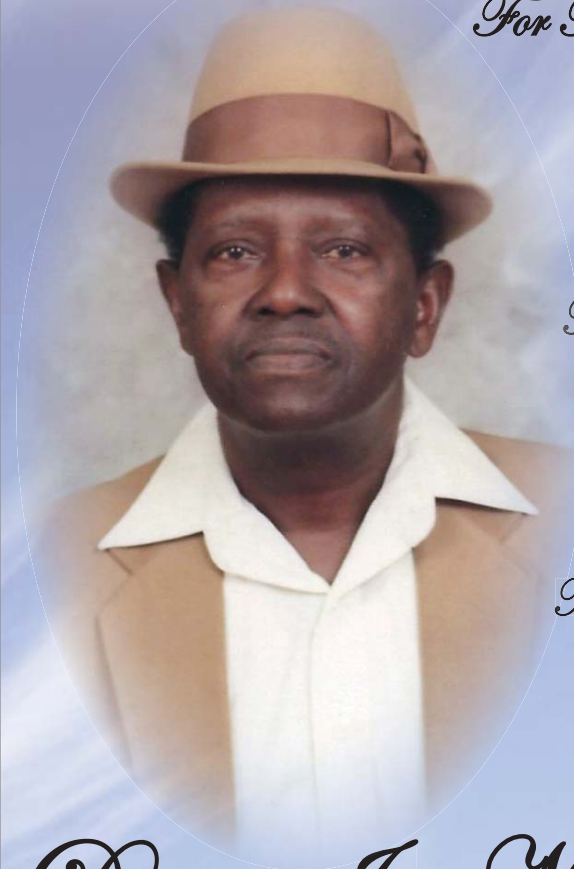

Life Reflections


