He received his formal education in the San Antonio Independent School District attending Sam Houston High School, where he was apart of The National Honor Society. While in high school, Samuel was given the opportunity to gain first hand experience in the Cosmetology Program. Upon graduation he became a Texas State Board Licensed Cosmetologist.

Samuel was baptized in the name of Jesus and received the Holy Ghost at Grace Temple where his father, Samuel L. Riley, Sr. was pastor. Samuel was an active member serving as an Usher and Choir Member. Upon returning to his home church, Greater Faith Temple Apostolic Church, Samuel became co-director of Generation Anointed with Praise Power (GAPP) Youth Choir. He loved to sing and praise God.

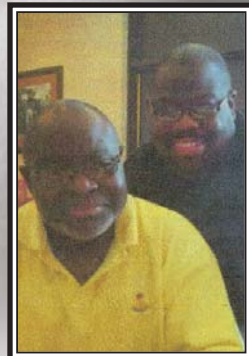
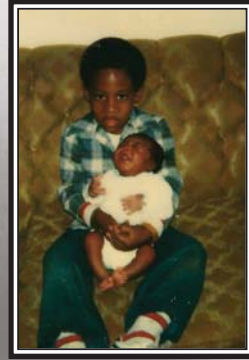
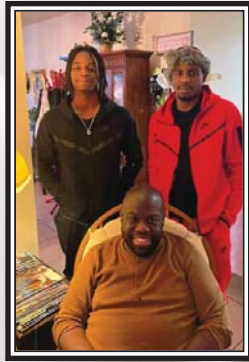

Remember the love that once we shared.

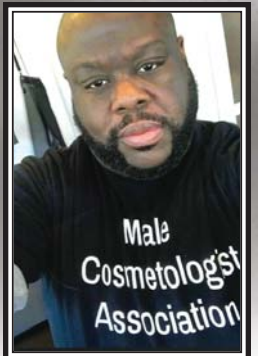
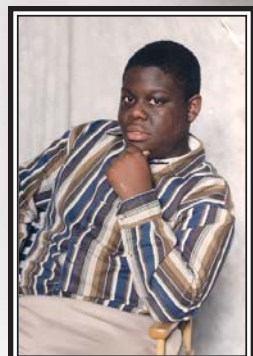
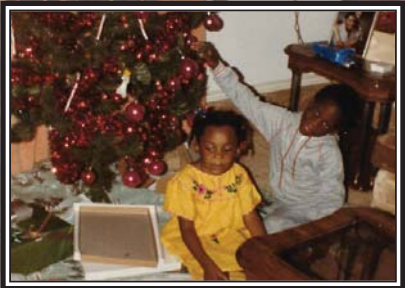
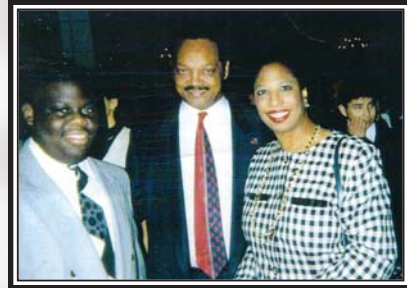
