Dr. Mary ann Brown was born on February 25, 1946 in Bastrop County to Superintendent Huland and Annie Lou Williams. As a child Mary attended Glen Oak Church of God in Christ and Dale Church of God in Christ where her father was the Pastor. She was educated in the Austin Independent School System where she graduated from Anderson High School in May of 1964.

Thus began her journey of pursuing higher education. Dr. Mary achieved this goal two years later in May, 1966 by receiving her Associates of Art Degree—Teacher Training from St. Phillips College in San Antonio, Texas. She went on to earn her Bachelor's of Arts degree in Elementary Education from Huston Tillotson College; a Masters of Education degree in Guidance from Prairie View A & M University; and ultimately a Doctor of Ministry Degree in Biblical Studies.


Dr. Mary spent her career in the Austin, Houston and San Antonio areas teaching elementary education. She especially had a heart for reaching out to hurting people, especially children. Dr. Mary devoted over forty-five years making a difference in the lives of people who were hurting as a teacher, counselor, writer, public speaker Outreach Coordinator and Evangelist Missionary.

Dr. Mary was an Ordained Minister of the Gospel; Director of her own Non-Traditional Private School for "at-risk" learners and Founder and Director of "Save Our Children Outreach" Program. Dr. Mary has created and implemented appropriate programs to meet the need of "at-risk" children and families at homeless sites, public schools, public libraries, community centers, churches and nursing homes. She published a large number of educational and Christian writings over the past forty-five years. Dr. Mary attributed her success in life to knowing her God-given purpose and choosing to do things God's way.

Dr. Mary met and married her husband, Elgin Lee Brown, Sr. on December 21, 1968. They welcomed their one and only child, a son, Elgin Lee Brown, Jr. on April 9, 1982.

She is preceded in death by her husband, mother, father and sisters, Doris Sue Williams and Ruby Elizabeth Williams, and brother-in-law Earl Conaway, Sr.

She leaves to cherish her memory her son, Elgin Lee Brown, Jr. (Jonell); three granddaughters: Elginae, Ja'Neyah, and E'Laysia; one grandson, E'Javion; Sisters: Annie Hue Hardin (Virgil), Ora Lee Thompson (Paul), Redell Ervin (Fred), Hazel Conaway, and Mildred Davis (Larry).
