Edward Lee Johnson Jr. “Bubba” began his story in Columbus, Texas. His mother Glenn Louise “Aunt Pick” Denley Johnson and Edward Lee “Uncle Lee” Johnson welcomed their second and final son on March 15, 1930. He joined his big brother, John Louis, who was his best friend and a great big brother.

Edward received his education in the Columbus School District. Upon graduation he joined the United States Army serving his country well. He completed his military career in the United States Army Reserves earning an Honorable Discharge for a Job Well Done. Edward went on to continue his education attending St. Phillips College where he graduated with his Associate Degree. Edward soon entered the workforce and was employed as a Mechanic at Lufkin Trailer Industries in San Antonio until he retired. Being the hard worker he was, even after retirement, Edward returned to Lufkin and worked several more years. He enjoyed the outdoors working as a Landscape Artist, a Custodial Employee at his church, a Substitute Teacher and various other jobs. Edward could not sit down. He was a great provider and a good person.

“Bubba” accepted Christ at an early age and grew up in St. Paul United Methodist Church in Columbus, Texas. Edward married the love of his life Evelyn Allean Glass on August 26, 1951, at St. James Baptist Church in Schulenburg, Texas and later relocated to San Antonio, Texas. Their family became complete with the birth of Pandora Johnson Milson in 1953 and Angela Allean Johnson in 1962. As one union, Bubba and Evelyn joined Shiloh Missionary Baptist Church, where they served most of their lives. They later served at Mt. Calvary Church for eight years before returning to Shiloh where they have remained members. Bubba and Evelyn were serious about their service to the Church and Community, spreading the word of God and serving the community. They would offer transportation to their church family, friends, and neighbors to the doctor, hospital, church, grocery store, or wherever they needed to go. They fed the homeless and did whatever was needed in their community until their health prevented them from doing so. Bubba always supported the community and his church in whatever efforts necessary and those efforts were also supported by Evelyn.

The same went for Evelyn as she served her community and church as well and was fully supported by Bubba. Over the years, Bubba served as a Deacon, a member of the Brotherhood, sung in the Church Choir, a Teacher and the BTU Director. He loved his family and showed it often. Whether it was the Johnson, Glass, Denley or Wilson side of the family, to him family was family, and he always welcomed family into his home. Bubba loved to cookout for them and did what was necessary for his family. He rarely missed any family reunion, he was a sharp dresser and loved to dress up, shop and go out to eat. He was a sharp dresser up until the time he was called home. When Bubba’s health started to fail, he loved to go shopping with Angela, put his outfits together and go out for a nice meal. His last day, he dressed up and went out with his baby girl to eat.

When Bubba got his Heavenly wings, he joined his parents, Edward Lee and Glenn Louise Johnson, his daughter, Pandora Johnson Milson, brother, John Louis as well as other close family.
