
Celebration of Life for Brother Paul Lloyd Warren

Obituary

Paul Lloyd Warren, the only child of the late Mr. Paul & Mrs. Igean Rothwell Warren, answered the call of God on July 3, 2022.

Paul accepted Christ at an early age in New York and was educated in the New York City public school district. Paul completed his education at the Monroe James Jewish High School. Instead of going to college, Paul enlisted in the United States Air Force. While in the Air Force, he held two career fields, Maintenance, and Air Police. Paul was an expert in marksmanship, hence, their desire for him to become part of the Air Police. Paul served his country for over 20 years, retiring in 1975 from Kelly Air Force Base; he received many awards and citations.

Paul enjoyed working and continued to work while attending the New Jersey Police Academy, as a commissioned security guard. Upon graduation, Paul became a civilian police officer. Paul also was an entrepreneur, owning and operating Warren's Pilot Car Service.

In November 2001, Paul met the love of his life, Lillian, at the Bexar County Tax Office. After a short engagement, Paul and Lillian were married in March of 2002 by the late Bishop Sarah F. Davis, who was the pastor of Bethel A.M.. Church at the time. Paul loved Lillian and knew if he wanted to keep her, he needed a church home. Paul joined Bethel and quickly became integrated into the work of the church. Paul was a member of the Sons of Allen, Usher Board No. 1, and The Bethel Aires. Paul was also a student of the Word; he attended Church School regularly until his health failed him.

Paul thoroughly enjoyed his life; he obtained an FCC License to operate the H.A.M. radio. Paul enjoyed remote control helicopters, flying kites, coloring (art in general), and disc jockeying. He had a passion for music after retiring and played music at the Officer's Club. Paul also LOVED sweets, particularly cookies and pineapple ice cream.

Paul was preceded in death by his mother, Mrs. Igean Rothwell Warren, his father, Mr. Paul Warren, and his mother-in-love, Mrs. Gussie Louise Triche.






