Rotary Charles Green, Sr. was born January 29, 1958 to Bertha Louise (Burlson) Green and Charlie Richard Green in Temple, Texas. Rotary received his formal education in the Temple Public School System. He later relocated to San Antonio, Texas attending Sam Houston High School where he graduated in 1975.

Rotary continued his education attending the University of Texas at Austin from 1975 to 1977. He then entered the United States Army in 1977. He completed his basic combat training at Fort Leonard Wood and served his country as an Environmental Health Specialist until his honorable discharge in 1980. Rotary began his Civil Servant career for the Federal Government as an Environmental Protection Specialist in 1981 at Fort Sam Houston, Texas. His career with the Federal Government spanned thirty-three years until his retirement in 2014. Rotary contributed to his community by coaching a local softball team. He also enjoyed sporting events, fishing, and having a good debate. Rotary made a covenant with Christ when he was baptized at Second Baptist Church in San Antonio, Texas.

Through a previous union, one son was born, Rotary Charles Green II.

In December of 2010, Rotary married Veronica Day in San Antonio, Texas. Along with Veronica came her three daughters, Tawney Day, Denise Day Horton, and Octavia Day, whom he helped to finish raising. As his bride, Veronica was by his side and cared for him until his passing on July 27th, 2022.

Rotary leaves to cherish his memory his wife, Veronica; son, Rotary II; stepchildren, Tawney and Denise; mother, Bertha; his brother, Charlie Jr. (Monica); two nephews, Charlie III and Cameron and a host of family and friends.
