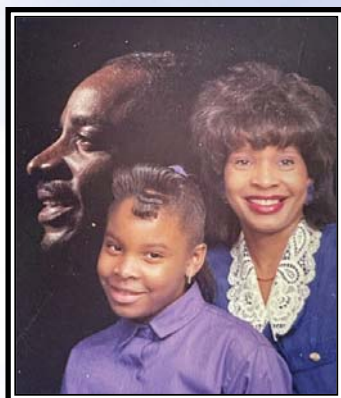
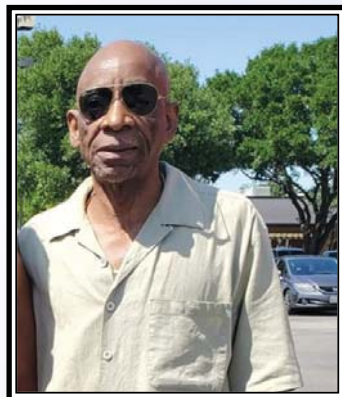

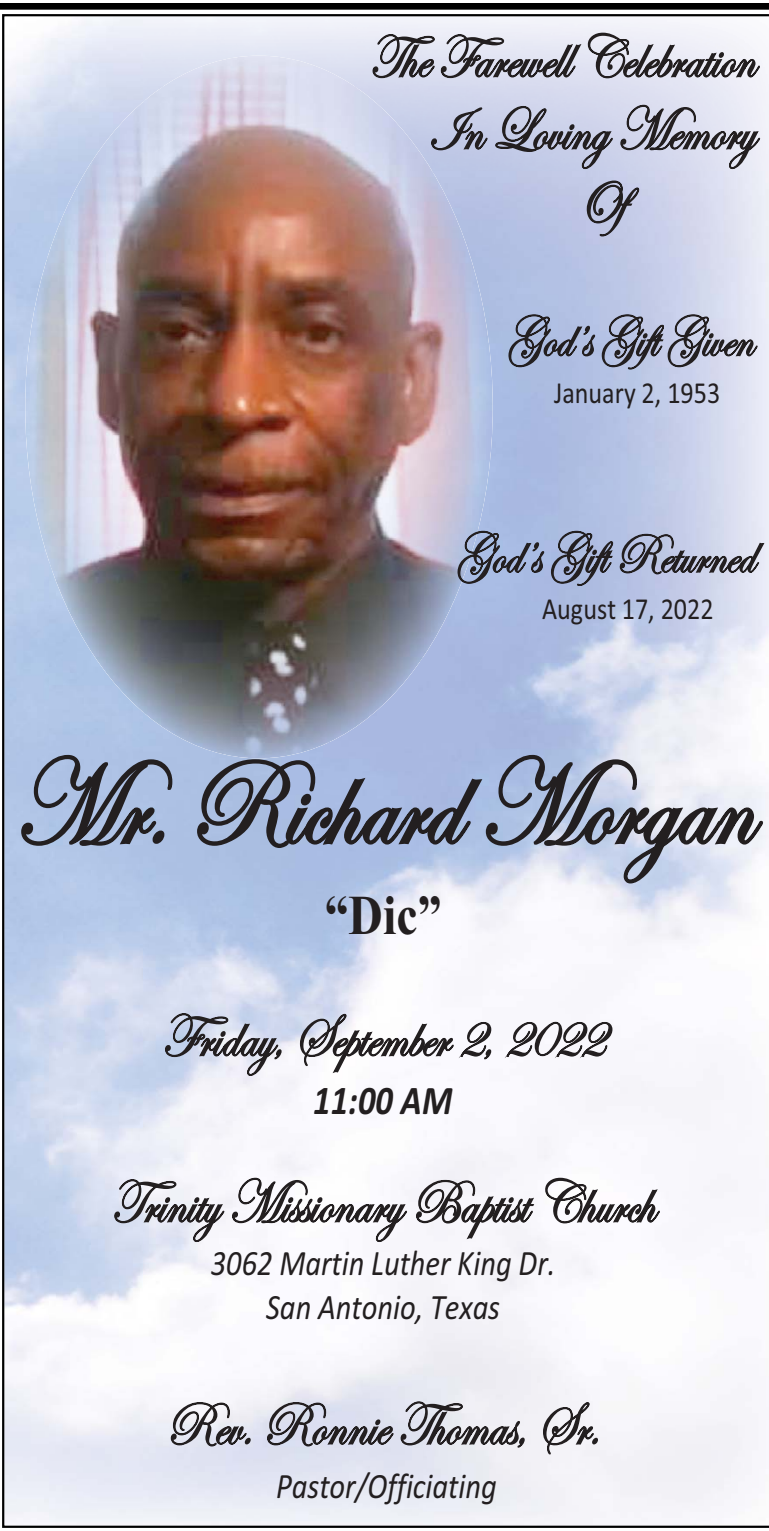

The Life Of Richard Morgan

Richard Morgan, the third child of seven children, was born to Arthur and Roberta Young-Morgan January 2, 1953 in San Antonio, Texas. He attended school in the San Antonio Independent School District, graduating in May of 1971. "Dic" as he was affectionately called by family and friends, accepted Christ at an early age and was later baptized at Second Baptist Church.

Richard met Denise and they dated for six years. They went on to unite in matrimony on July 7, 1979 and to this union their only daughter, Chaka, was born. Richard and Denise remained as one for sixteen years. Richard was a part of the workforce and was employed with Brady Green Hospital and University Hospital for a total of thirty-two years, as a Surgical Technician in Labor and Delivery. He loved his job and always bragged about all the babies he helped deliver.

Richard was a member of the Army National Guard in the early 70's. He retired in February 2008 and worked part-time after his retirement at the AT&T Center as an Usher for the Spurs Games. Family members and friends knew that "Dic" was a die-hard Dallas Cowboy's and San Antonio Spurs fan.

Richard continued his relationship with Christ and in 2014 he joined Trinity Missionary Baptist Church, where he was a member of the choir. He attended church until his health began to fail.

The soul of our loved one, Richard departed this earth and blossomed into Heaven's Garden on August 17, 2022 at his home peacefully under VITAS Hospice care, family members and friends.
