The gates of memories will never close

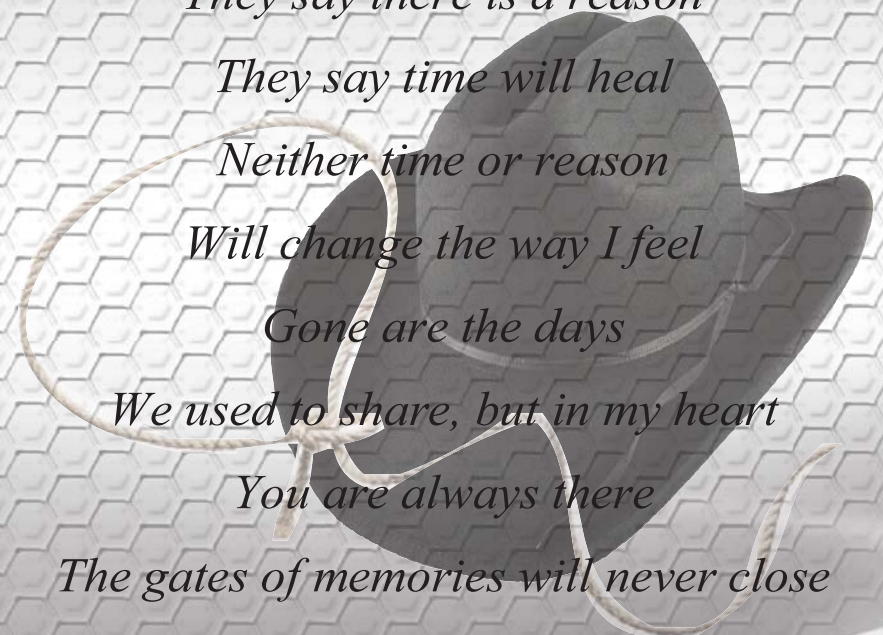

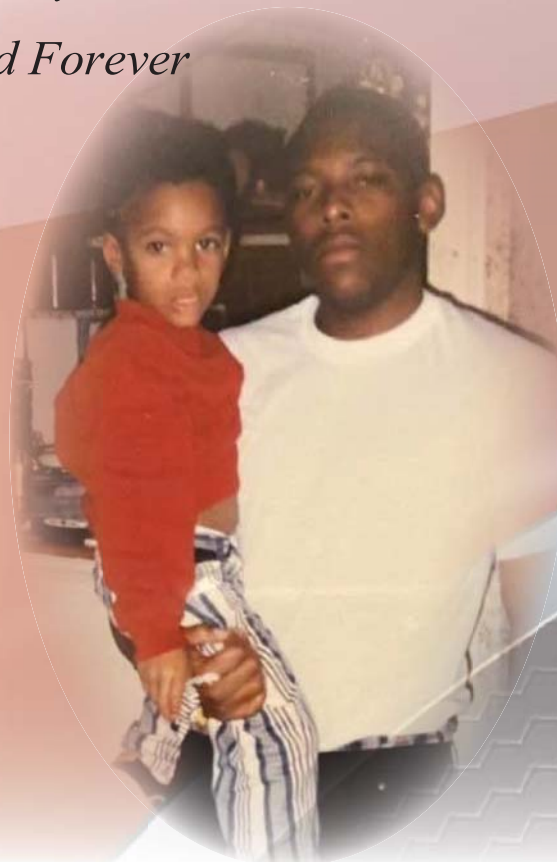
