Stephanie then asked Larry if he was grateful, and he replied "Yes" and he peacefully slept into a coma. Larry was unresponsive for hours until his Aunt Mary prayed the Lord's Prayer, the 23rd Psalms and shortly after he was awake again with full instructions. He let everyone know that he was strong and told us all to be strong. Larry mouthed in words and body language to remove the life support so he could now go home with the lord. Because of God's grace covering him, Larry endured no pain, zero suffering, and he looked so good and seemed as if nothing was wrong. Larry specifically asked for Tyrone and Lynel, Aunt Mary, Aunt Precious, and Uncle Eural. Larry ordered to have his granddaughter RiRi picked up from school and be brought to the hospital, where he laughed and played with his granddaughter for the last time.
