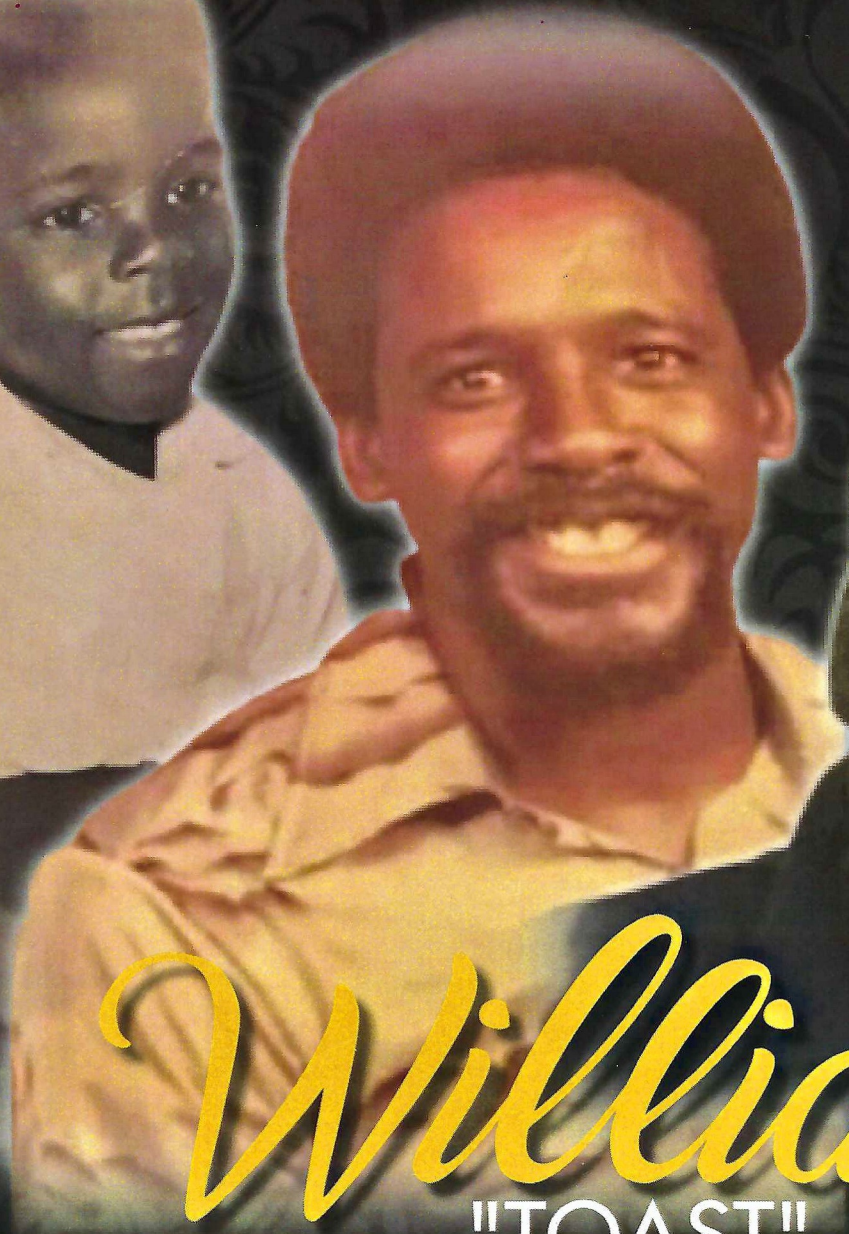
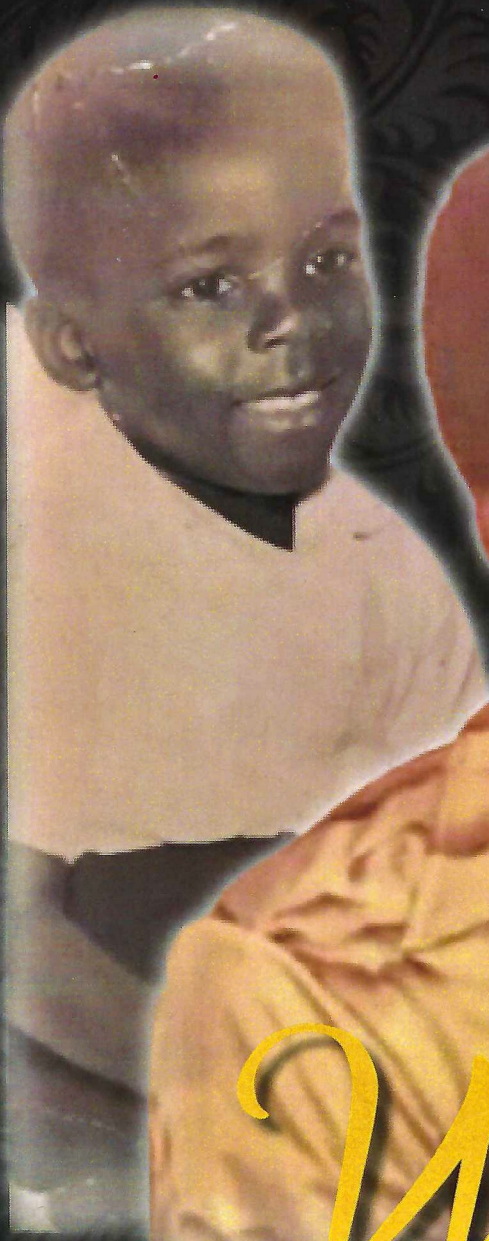

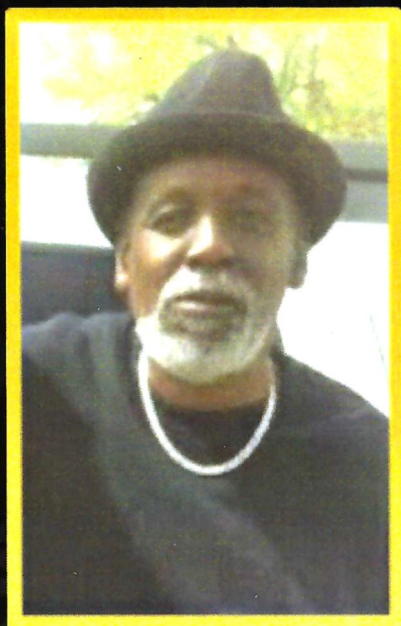

Obituary

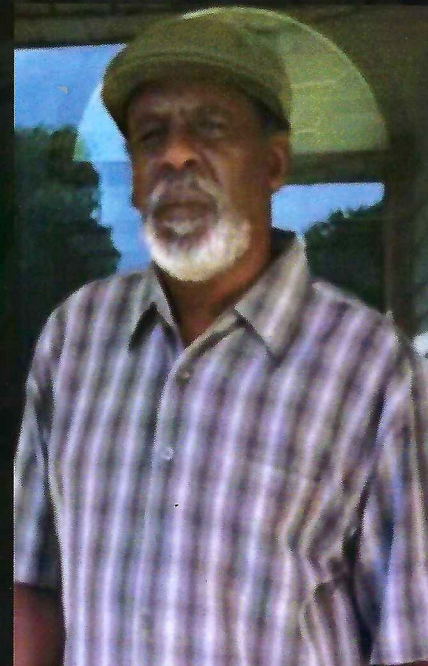
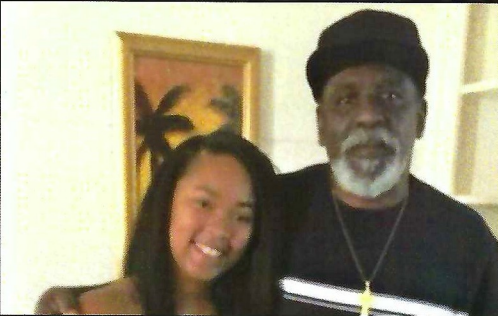
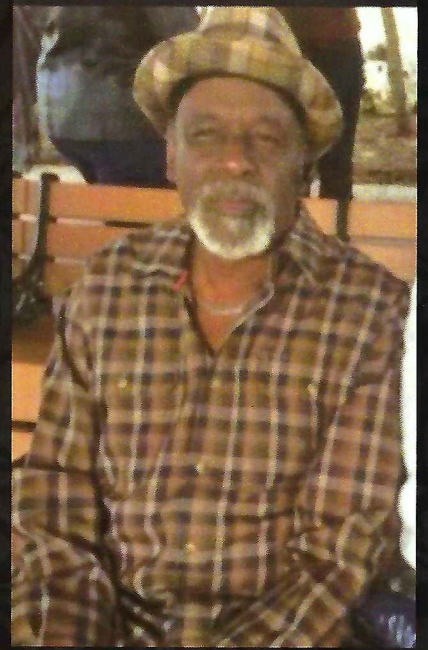


William "Toast" Stanfield was born June 11, 1946 in San Antonio, TX to Roosevelt and Willie Mae Evans Stanfield. At the time of birth, he was the third child and second son. He attended school in the San Antonio Independent School District at Cuney Elementary, Douglass Jr. High, and George Brackenridge High School; where he was known to be very smart and able to catch on to any subject. As a youngster, William was very active and would spend time playing outside playing sports with his friends and brother. Along with his two older siblings, he was in the school band and played the trumpet. He was musically inclined and could play several musical instruments on his own, including the guitar and the piano.

William's parents raised all their children to know and love Jesus. The Stanfield family attended church together regularly at Greater Lincoln Park Temple, where he accepted Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior. One of his favorite gospel songs was "Jesus Lover of My Soul". William loved Jesus and his family! William traveled the country and spent time living in Houston, TX and Los Angeles, CA. William joined the United States Navy and eventually he returned home to San Antonio, Texas where he stayed until God called him home. William received an Associates Degree from St. Philip's College. He worked for the downtown Baptist Hospital and eventually became a dedicated staff member of the San Antonio Independent School District. William knew how to handle the students with love and a stern caring heart. Whenever students would act unruly in the classroom, Mr. Stanfield was always called to get the situation under control, and he did. As a dedicated educator he was a wiz in math and he worked throughout the SAISD District until his retirement.

William was preceded in death by his Father and Mother (Roosevelt Stanfield & Willie Mae Evans Stanfield), Brother (Franklin Roosevelt Stanfield) and Grandparents (Cormelius and Luella Evans and Phelbert Stanfield).
