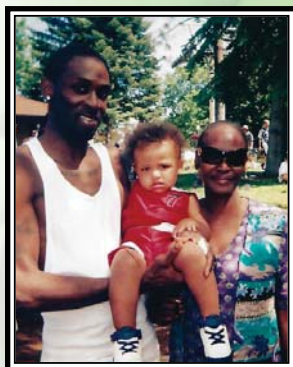


Precious Memories
