Perhaps my time seemed all too brief,

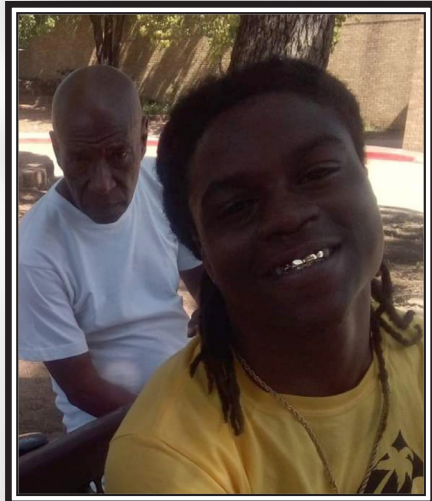
Don't lengthen it now with undue grief.
