



Our father, grandfather, pastor and friend, Overseer Dr. Robert N. Jackson, Jr., courageously finished his race on Wednesday, January 18, 2023. He was 100 years young.

Dr. Jackson was born October 30, 1922, in Springhill (Mobile), AL. He served in the United States Army during World War II, participating in the Western Pacific campaign. It was during this time that he began to know and experience God for himself. He was baptized "in the name of Jesus in the ocean of the Pacific on the 11th of June", 1943. The very next day, he was baptized with the Holy Ghost.

In February 1946, he was anointed to preach the gospel at Glorious Holy Church of God in Pensacola, FL. It was in that same church that he met and married the love of his life, Eula Mae Jackson. Their love created four wonderful children - Joseph, Delores, RoSharon and Robert, III.

In 1949, he was ordained as an Elder in the A.O.H church. He served as Assistant Pastor of the Adam Street A.O.H. church under the leadership of the late Bishop W.T. Phillips. In 1967, God called him and his family to San Antonio, TX where he founded Gethsemane A.O.H. Church at 107 South Pine Street. He served as Overseer over churches in Alabama, Florida, Mississippi, Michigan, and Indiana. In 1972, he was then called to the Dayton, OH area where he both pastored and served in ministry at area churches: Mt Zion A.O.H. Church, Emmanuel Chapel, and New Life Worship Center. After the passing of his son-in-law, Vivan Mackey, Jr, he was once again the pastor of Gethsemane A.O.H. Church.

Dr. Jackson was more than just a minister; he was a passionate educator as well. He spent over thirty years in education, teaching and mentoring in Career Planning & Development at Sinclair Community College. Always seeking out knowledge, he completed his Doctor of Divinity in 1991, Doctor of Philosophy in 1992, and his Ph.D. in Christian Administration in 1994.

Dr. Jackson enjoyed golf with his friends, philosophical conversations with his family, holding babies, ministering to others, and living a life that showed the goodness and mercy of God. He was preceded in passing by his mother, Odelia Milligan, wife, Eula Mae Jackson, and son-in-law, Vivan Mackey, Jr.

He leaves to cherish his memory and carry on his legacy, his children - Joseph W (Alma) Jackson, Mobile, AL; Delores R. Mackey, San Antonio, TX; RoSharon E. Molden, Dayton, OH; Robert N. (Carla) Jackson, Dayton, OH; grandchildren - Vivan Mackey, III, Robert E.
