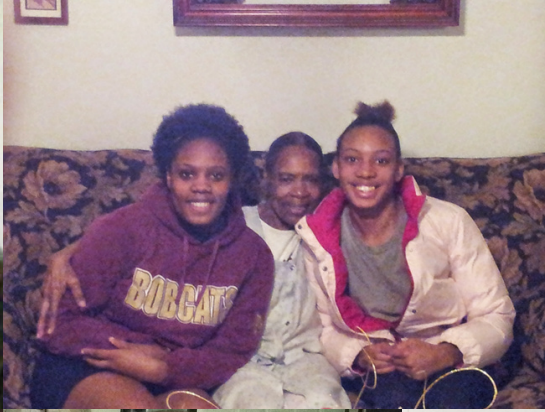
Sallie married Orashious Graves October 4, 1950 and they remained happily married until his demise on January 19, 2001. They reared their family with love and in the lord.
