

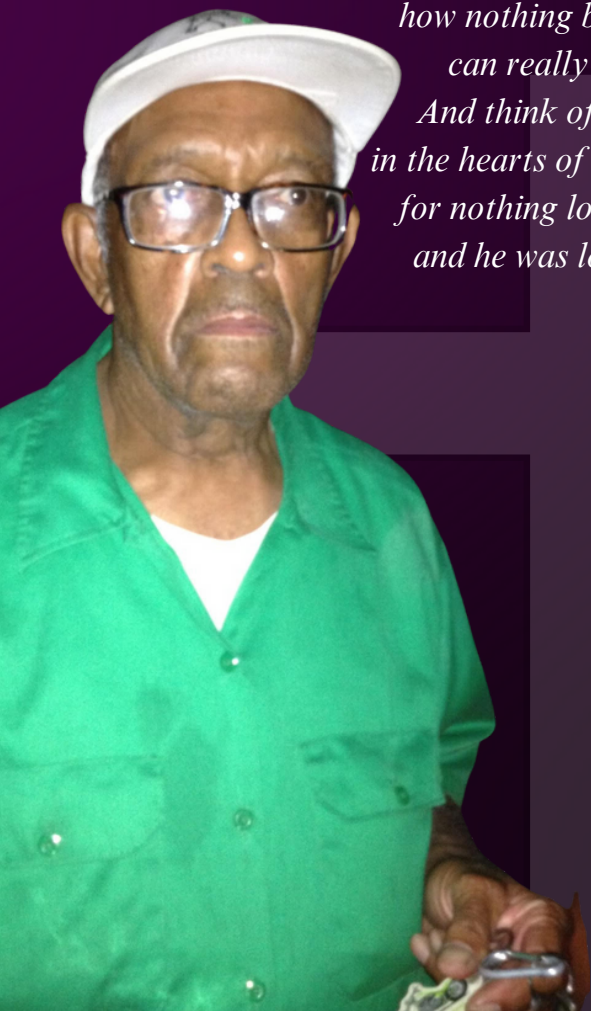
His Journey's Just Begun
