The Life of Ronald "Sled Dog"

Ronald Oneil Wagner was born on April 4, 1974 in San Antonio, Texas to Denise Wagner and Leon Lott. Ronald was God fearing and accepted Christ at an early age. During his childhood years, Ronald was loved and cherished by many including Mamie Lott (mama), Gloria Wagner (Lottie), and Collins Lott (Collins). His grade school journey was one familiar to Eastside San Antonio. He attended WW White Elementary School, Martin Luther King Middle school, and he was a proud Cherokee graduating from Sam Houston High School in 1992. Along this journey, Ronald was acknowledged for his athletic talents. He was awarded All-District and All-City honors for his football prowess. His skill set allowed him to pursue collegiate opportunities. He would take his talents to Trinity Valley Jr. College, where he was a key member of their Juco National Championship team, Texas A&M Kingsville, and Angelo State University. At Angelo State, he continued his stellar play and was awarded All-American and received the designation of being placed in the ASU Hall of Honor. Ronald, became the first Collegiate graduate of his family; graduating from Angelo State University in 1999, with a Bachelor of Arts in Kinesiology and minor in Art.

Ronald met the love of his life Chandra Lafond in 1997 in San Angelo, Texas. Ronald and Chandra made their union before God and family on March 12, 2005 in San Antonio, Texas. This union gifted them with three proud sons Jalon O. Wagner, Sean T. Wagner, and Chad J. Wagner who they raised in Arlington, Texas. Ronald dedicated over twenty years to coaching football, powerlifting, and softball in various High Schools in San Antonio and in the DFW area including A. Maceo Smith, Arlington Sam Houston, South Oak Cliff, Desoto, Terrell, and Lancaster.

While at Lancaster, Ronald worked as a top assistant coach helping the team to achieve top 5 offenses for four of his years, become six time District Champs, four times quarter finalist, and make an appearance in the State Championship game in 2012. His coaching and leadership produced many All-District, All-Area, and All-State athletes. Under his leadership, numerous players received athletic scholarships. Ronald's coaching abilities were not just limited to football. He also became a state qualifying powerlifting coach while at Lancaster. Ronald left Lancaster after a successful tenure in 2021, where he completed his coaching journey. Soon after retirement, Ronald gave way to his insatiable calling to be surrounded by more family and he relocated his family back to San Antonio, Texas in 2021.
