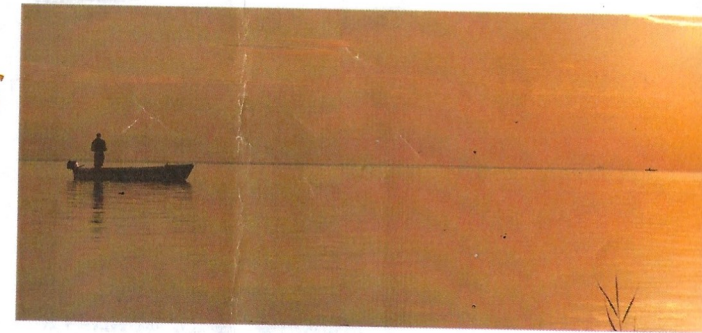
4 Yea, though I walk through the valley of the
