'Welcome Home'.

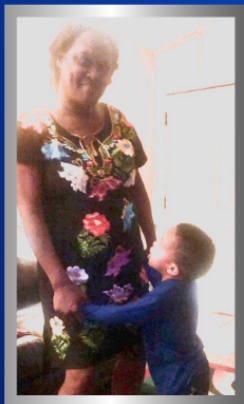
