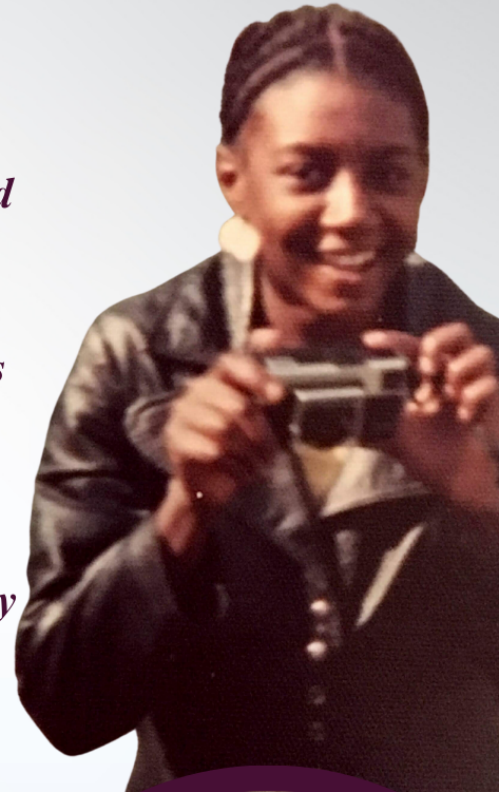

A Life of Ministry and Service

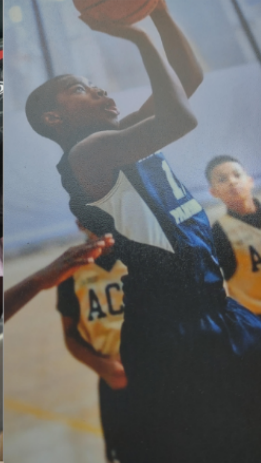

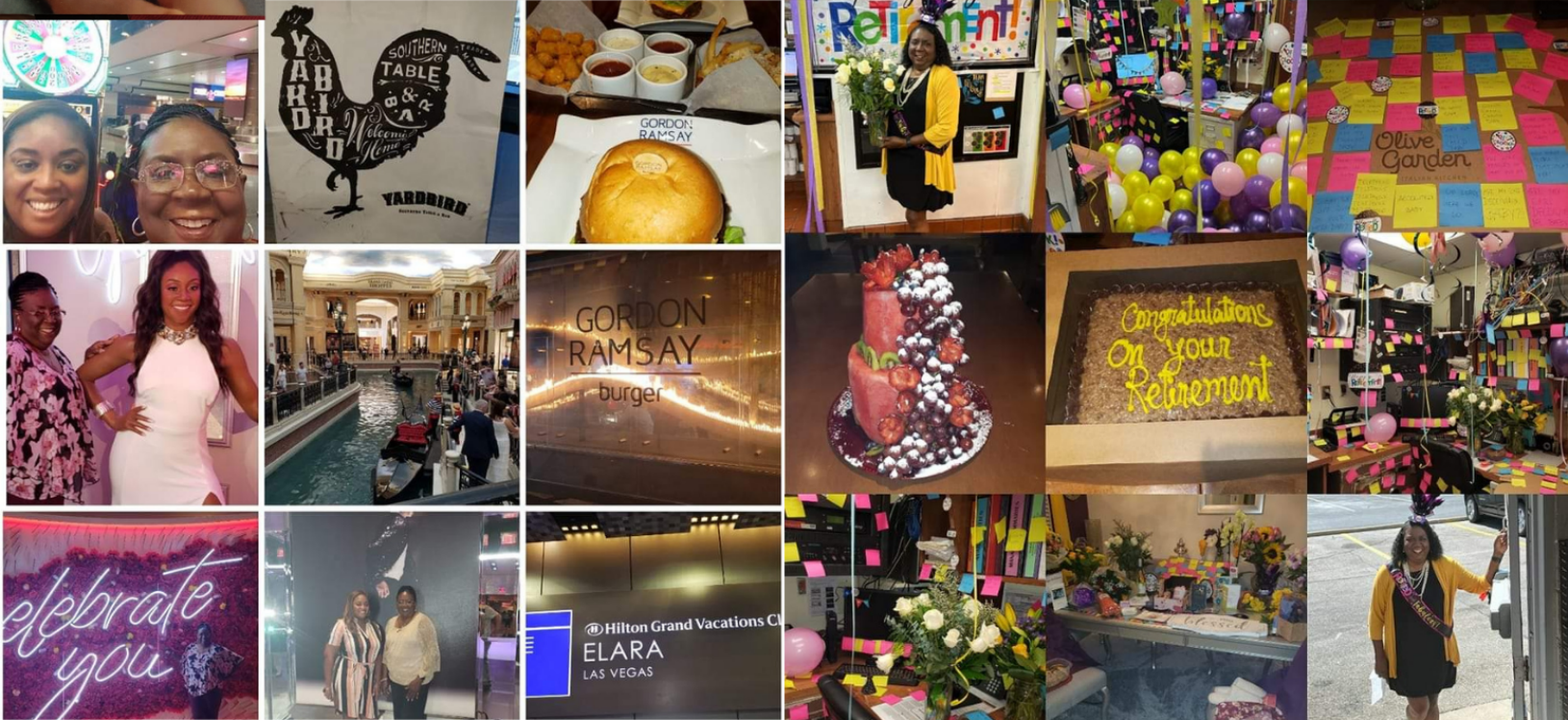
