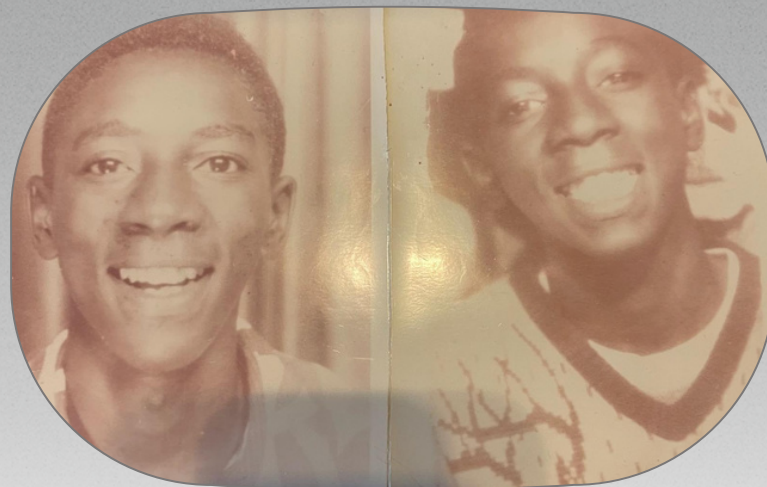


Life's Journey
