James Willie Myart, Jr. was born October 4, 1954 in San Antonio Texas to the late James Willie Myart, Sr. and Inze Estelle Myart. He was the youngest of five children, Brenda, Harold, Carol and Janet "twin". James attended Hope Cumberland Presbyterian Church in America where he was an active member for many years, under the pastorage of Rev. James W. Myart, Sr. and Rev. Harold Myart, Sr.

James received his education in the San Antonio Independent School District attending Tynan Elementary, Emerson Middle School and Fox Tech High School where he graduated in the fall of 1971. He entered college early at St. Mary's University where he studied Political Science earning his B.A and M.A Degree graduating Cumlaude. James furthered his education attending the University Of Texas at Austin where he received his Juris Doctorate Law Degree.

James entered the workforce starting his civic and work ethic in the EEOC Department with the City Of San Antonio. He was then tapped to become the first black citizen to lead a department with Bexar County as head of the Automobile Registration Department. James relocated from Bexar County to start a business with his brother, "Myart and Myart Mechanicals". It was then that James entered Law School to fulfill his passion for the law. James initiated a National Lawsuit against the Department of Agriculture on behalf of Black Farmers in the United States for their unfair treatment in allowing loans and funding. James was also instrumental in changing how adoptions are secured in the State Of Texas. Above all that he did civically and politically, James first love was his family.

James was proceeded in death by his parents, Rev. James Willie Myart, Sr. and Inze Estelle Myart, sisters, Brenda Thomas, Carol Chambers, Curly Daniels and Janet Prince "his twin". He leaves to cherish his memory his children, James Willie Myart III, Garlington Jerome, Dacrie Erin Brooks and Andre Lamont; brother, Harold Myart (Emma); sister, LaVerne Burdett, Ft. Worth, Texas; nine grandchildren, eight great grandchildren, one very devoted cousin, Otto Harrison and a host of neices, nephews, other cousins and friends.
