### CLOSE FRIEND – MARILYN STEPHENS

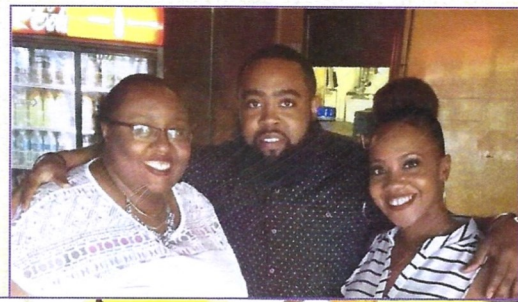
