William received his formal education in the Lockhart Public School System attending Lockhart High School where he graduated in 1977. He continued his education attending SWT located in San Marcos, Texas. William entered the workforce working for Eeds Funeral Home in Lockhart, Texas, EMS in San Marcos, Texas, Police Departments in various cities,

City Bailiff, Traffic Court in San Antonio, Texas, City Marshall in San Antonio, Texas and Carter-Taylor Williams Mortuary in San Antonio, Texas for over thirty years. William was the 1st African American City Marshall in the history of San Antonio. He loved working in funeral homes, preaching and listening to gospel music, and of course, he loved eating good food. William loved hearing the word coming from two preachers more than anything, Bishop William Ellis and Bishop Noel Jones.
