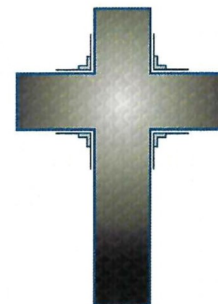

## Clarence "CC's Story

Clarence Carpenter was born to parents Amos Lee Carpenter, Sr., and Irene Bilton Carpenter on February 17, 1952 in San Antonio, Texas. He departed this life early on Friday morning, December 15, 2023, after an extended illness. He is preceded in death by both parents, his older brother, Glenn, and his only child Clarence Carpenter, Jr. (March 16, 2023).

Clarence was raised in San Antonio and matriculated the San Antonio ISD school system. After school he went to work for the Rogers Cable Company where he worked for a period of time and then went to work for the Zachary Construction Company where his older brother Glenn worked. After working for Zachary for a few years, he decided to go to work on his own and began doing "handyman" work repairing houses, plumbing and general construction jobs. This became his lifelong work until his health would no longer allow him to pursue it on a regular basis.

Clarence was the youngest of three boys who grew up in the Denver Heights neighborhood on the east side of San Antonio. He loved the east side where his friends, cousins and neighbors lived.
