

Obituary

The US Marines sent them to San Diego, CA and to this union a beloved son, Craig E. Harrison was born April 12, 1966. With John receiving orders to Vietnam, Pearl and Craig moved to Los Angeles, CA.

Filled with the holy spirit at home as a teenager, Craig loved to sing in the choir and usher. He participated in a youth group at Gethsemane COGIC. He sang in the choir at Testimonial Church of God in Christ in California and continued to work as a choir member at Childress Memorial COGIC from 1978 to 1983 when the family moved to San Antonio under the leadership of Bishop T. 






































Life is but a Stopping Place
