

On September 1st, 1939, Charles was born to the parentage of Henry and Lillian Hamilton. Upon the passing of his mother "Lillian Miller-Hamilton", Charles was then raised by his mother "Minnie Hamilton". Charles spiritual upbringing began at the Zion Star Baptist Church and Jones Chapel Methodist Church Kenwood Addition. He also attended the church home of his aunt "Thelma Robinson", New Hope Baptist Church where the Reverend T. H. Robinson was the Pastor. As a young person, he joined the New Light Baptist Church and remembers the Pastor, "The Late Dr. P. S. Wilkinson", as being an inspiration in his young life.

Bro. Hamilton is grateful that he came from a family that instilled in him a strong work ethic, and the value of a good day's work in a man's life. During his earlier years, he cut grass in the neighborhood for friends and family, worked as a bus boy, shined shoes, he worked as a soda fountain clerk and later as a carpenter helper. Mr. Hamilton never let the words, "An Idol Mind Is the Devils Worshop" apply to him, and he believed if more young people spent more time working, they would not be in the situation many find themselves in today. Brother Charles Hamilton's favorite scripture is, St. John 14.

Brother Hamilton attended and graduated from Phyllis Wheatley High School, moving on to St. Phillips College, later graduating from Shaw's Barber College. While getting his education he continued to work at Trinity University Cafeteria, Joske's of Texas, Sommer's Wearhouse, San Antonio Housing Authority Maintenance Department, Brooks AFB, Texas Barber Shop, Fort Sam Houston Army Base Cafeteria, the Hilton and St. Anthony Hotels. He also worked for a "Movie Star", at Big John Hamilton's Steak House on Austin Hwy. His professional occupation is as follows, Rehab Therapist - S. A. Not only did Brother Hamilton work at the church, but he has always been an active part of the musical arts in San Antonio and was always active in the Ouartet Association. He sang with "The Original Kings of Harmony", of San Antonio, Texas. Mr. Hamilton also sang with "The Gospel Marvelaires", of San Antonio, Texas. Charles Hamilton was a quiet, peaceful gentle giant who would add grace and dignity to his surroundings. Rather than speak about his salvation, Bro. Hamilton exemplified his Christianity through his actions and his deeds. In his relaxation time you could find him making tapes/videos/CD's, collecting gospel music, collecting poems/art, browsing through antique shops, walking and watching sports.

During his journey, he met and fell in love with his late wife "Florence Blackwell", and they remained married for 44 years until her death on September 11, 2020.

On February 14, 2024, Charles' Lord and Savior bent down and kissed him with a kiss of love and took him to rest eternally in Him.
